



NCQA Physician Recognition Programs

Providers are able to obtain recognition from the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) for successfully completing up to five certification programs. A physician who has obtained any of these certifications will have the corresponding seal next to their name to note this achievement. To assist members in making health care decisions, physicians who have successfully completed any of the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) certification program(s) can be identified through the **Provider Search** function on MVP's website.

A description of each of the five programs is as follows:

- The Physician Practice Connections' Program (PPC) recognizes a physician practice that has demonstrated application of clinical information systems, patient education and support, and care management to improve the health care delivered to his or her patients.
- The Diabetes Recognition Program (DRP) recognizes physicians who demonstrate that they provide high quality care to their patients with diabetes.
- The Heart Stroke Recognition Program (HSRP) recognizes physicians who demonstrate that they provide high quality care to patients with cardiac conditions or who have had a stroke.
- The Back Pain Recognition Program (BPRP) recognizes physicians who provide high-value, patient-centered care for patients with low back pain.
- The Physician Practice Connections-Patient Centered Medical Home (PPC-PCMH) recognizes physician practices functioning as medical homes by using systematic, patient-centered and coordinated care management processes.
